## Play is the Way

Founding members of Play is The Way and the Winthrop School both located in Ipswich MA., are co-sponsoring a virtual community screening of the critically acclaimed documentary, Chasing Childhood. Chasing Childhood explores the devolution of free range play opportunities for our children resulting in a generation that is over-protected and over-directed. American children are wilting under the weight of well-meaning parents. In the pursuit of keeping them safe and creating an impressive resumé of extracurricular activities to wow admissions boards, over-parenting smothers children across socioeconomic classes. This thoughtful film follows education professionals and reformed helicopter parents who seek and offer solutions for developing more confident, independent young people while restoring some joy and freedom to childhood.

Chasing Childhood is a feature length documentary that explores a phenomenon affecting kids from a broad range of socioeconomic backgrounds. Free play and independence have all but disappeared, supplanted by relentless perfectionism and record high anxiety and depression. What's lost goes well beyond our idyllic conceptions of childhood past. When kids don't play unsupervised by adults, they don't gain critical life skills: grit, independence, and resourcefulness. Though they may appear more accomplished on paper, by the time they get to college they are often falling apart, lacking the emotional tools to navigate young adulthood.

Chasing Childhood will stream for pre-registered participants starting on Wednesday May 19th through Friday May 21st. In addition local scholar, Dr. Peter Gray, from Boston College, will lead a follow-up virtual community lecture/discussion on Thursday, May 27th at 7-pm. Dr. Gray is featured in the film and is leading community discussions across the country. The Ipswich Public Library children's room has added 10 copies to their circulation of Dr. Peter Gray's latest publication, Free to Learn, Why unleashing the instinct to play will make our children happier, more self-reliant and better students for life. In addition, please check out The Play is the Way art show at Zumi's from May 16-May 30th. The Winthrop school has scheduled a playground upgrade including a mud kitchen, to encourage more supervised unstructured child directed play.

May is Mental Health month and there is no better time to take stock in our children's wellbeing. After a year of Covid restrictions, families have already begun to adapt to less over scheduling of organized group activities, while promoting at home creative play. Educators, administrators and families can expand on these opportunities by providing some well needed "exhaling" time for our children.


