This program empowers children and gives real-world connections, teaching kids what to do before, during, and after an emergency while fostering critical 21st-century skills such as problem solving, teamwork, creativity, leadership, and communication. Students will work individually and in teams to research emergencies that can impact communities locally and nationally, and apply creativity and literacy skills to demonstrate their understanding of emergency preparedness. Students who complete this program will receive a Go Kit to bring to their homes, which will contain a flashlight, radio, first aid kit and other emergency supplies to bring home to further their preparedness efforts.

#### <u>Check Mate</u> – Grades: 4, 5 - Thursdays 2:00 - 3:30

What do Harry Potter and the Jedi have in common? A love for the magical game of chess! All abilities are welcome to come learn more about the game of chess. In this ACE session we will cover the basics of the board and pieces, basic strategies and friendly competition to test our new sills.

In this program the history of Ipswich will be brought to life! Participants will learn about lighting in the 17th and 18th century here in Ipswich. Students will also have a hands-on opportunity to make hand-dipped candles, as well as candles formed by using molds, and how candles were used then and now.

#### Lego Literacy: Telling Your Own Story - Grades: 2, 3 - Fridays 3:00-4:00

Over the five weeks, we will experiment with different ways to tell a story—from traditional stories to graphic novels to Stop Motion animation. At the end of the final session, you can invite family and friends to hear one of your original Lego stories.
