

## **ACCEPTANCE OF CHILDREN OF NONRESIDENT PROFESSIONAL PERSONNEL**

Professional Personnel in the Ipswich Public Schools who are not residents of Ipswich shall be able to have their school age child(ren) attend the Ipswich Public Schools subject to the following conditions:

- The Ipswich Public Schools shall be under no obligation to supply transportation to such children.
- Admission of Professional Personnel tuition-free students pursuant to this policy will be limited to those positions which the Ipswich Public Schools determines to be available in various grades or classes. Nonresident children will not be admitted if such admission would cause class sizes or pupil-teacher ratios to exceed maximums acceptable to the School Committee in its sole discretion. The School Committee also reserves the right to set maximum numbers of nonresident Professional Personnel's children.
- If the Nonresident Professional Personnel's' child becomes a discipline problem, all appropriate discipline policies and regulations of the Ipswich Public Schools shall apply.
- Any Nonresident Professional Personnel's child attending the Ipswich Public Schools on a tuition-free basis will be considered a school choice applicant if such openings occur. If chosen by lottery, the student will be considered a choice student. If not chosen by lottery, they will continue to attend the Ipswich Public Schools as defined under this policy.
- If the Nonresident Professional Personnel is no longer employed by the district, the child is allowed to stay in the district as long as the student(s) pay the per pupil expenditure as determined by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education for that year.
